

## Optical attenuation in fiber optic receivers

Optical attenuation is the gradual loss of flux (light intensity) as an optical signal travels through a fiber. Measured in decibels (dB), it's the logarithmic ratio of the output power to the input power. A standard single-mode fiber operating at 1550 nm loses.
